



• A blended learning approach combines face to face classroom methods with computer-mediated activities to form an integrated instructional approach.

• In addition, the terms "blended," "hybrid," and "mixed-mode" are used interchangeably in current research literature.

- The goal of a blended approach is to join the best aspects of both face to face and online instruction.
- In addition to flexibility and convenience for students, according to research shared at the ALN Conference Workshop on Blended Learning & Higher Education November 17, 2005, there is early evidence that a blended instructional approach can result in learning outcome gains and increased enrollment retention.

• The blend of face to face and online materials will vary depending on the content, the needs of the students, and the preferences of the instructor.

- They point out that the term has become a bandwagon for almost any form of teaching containing "two or more different kinds of things that can then be mixed".
- Their main objection is that generally the distinctions being drawn don't exist, or aren't productive. For example, the blending of elearning with traditional learning implies that there can be an unblended form of e-learning in which no traditional learning occurs.



Components Needed for a Blended Learning Model

- 1. Your first class should always be Face-to-Face (or at least Real-Time) if possible.
- 2. Assessments should be real-time and the choice of F2F or online should be made available.
- 3. There must be multiple times throughout the class that are synchronously conducted.
- 4. Differentiate your Content Delivery and Discussion Methods.
- 5. Keep the Class Size Limited.
